





Why MSCA?


- General H2020 proposals requires a consortium of 3-15 partners



What does it offer?

High-quality research training delivered through international and interdisciplinary networks, industrial doctorates or joint doctorates

Who applies?

International networks of research organisations from the academic and nonacademic sectors

Who is funded?

Researchers at doctoral level (less than four years of full-time research experience and no doctoral degree)

Individual Fellowships

What does it offer?

Opportunities to work on personal research projects by moving between countries and possibly sectors to acquire new skills

Who applies?

Individual researchers together with the host organisation

Who is funded?

Postdoctoral researchers



RISE

Research and Innovation Staff Exchange

What does it offer?

The exchange of staff members involved in research and innovation to develop sustainable collaborative projects and the transfer of knowledge

Who applies?

International networks of research organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors

Who is funded?

Researchers, technical, administrative and managerial staff of any nationality and at all career levels



COFUND

Co-Funding of Regional, National and International Programmes

What does it offer?

Regional, national or international programmes to foster excellence in researchers' training, mobility and career development

Who applies?

Organisations funding or managing doctoral programmes or fellowship programmes

Who is funded?

Researchers at doctoral and postdoctoral level



 Individual trans-national fellowships to the best and most promising experienced* researchers
 (* PhD or 4-year full-time equivalent research experience)

Global Fellowships (GF)

- ➤ Secondments of 3 6 months in Europe (MS or AC), for greater impact
- > Specific eligibility criteria
- Career development with an appropriate intersectoral dimension

An Experienced Researcher may submit only one proposal to this call for proposals.

For fellows coming to or moving within Europe (duration 12-24 months)







Global Fellowships

For fellows from Europe going to Third countries (12-24 months) returning to Europe (12 months)

MSCA Project training activities



Realistic and well-defined objectives in terms of career advancement or resuming a research career after a break.

- > Training-through-research: individual personalised action
- ➤ Hands-on training activities for developing scientific (new techniques, instruments) and transferable skills (proposal preparation, IPR management, task coordination, supervising & monitoring, exploitation of research results)
- Inter-sectoral or interdisciplinary transfer of knowledge (secondments)
- > Organisation of scientific/training/dissemination events
- > Communication, outreach activities and horizontal skills
- > Training dedicated to **gender iss**

MSCA IF Secondments



A transfer of knowledge which contributes significantly to the impact of the fellowship.


Fellowship Duration	Maximum duration of secondment
≤ 18 months	3 months
> 18 months	6 months

- Secondment should be clearly described in proposal
- Can be a single period or divided into multiple shorter periods
- > Can be at more than one partner organisation located in Europe
- > Can be to an institution in the same country as the beneficiary
- Can be in the same sector
- No letter of commitment needed
- > Is different from **short visit** (e.g. field work), which can be done in a TC



Definition of CAREER BREAK in research:

Not have been <u>active in research</u> for at least 12 consecutive months within the 18 months immediately prior to the deadline for submission of proposals (13/03/17 to 12/09/18).

active in research is determined on the basis of:

A.fellowships in research domain or


B.employment contracts in research domain

The **professional status** should be clearly explained in the proposal, **both in part A and B** (e.g. unemployment, parental/sick leave, no fellowship/ employment contract in research)

Society & Enterprise Panel

- ➤ Beneficiary ONLY from NON-ACADEMIC sector
- Mobility rule: Not resided/worked/studied > 36 months in the 5 years immediately before the call deadline, in the country of the beneficiary
- ➤ **Budget:** 8 million € (2018)







Global Fellowships (GF)



Duration: between 24 and 36 months

12-24 months initial outgoing phase in a in a Third Country +

12 months of mandatory return phase

Host Institution (future Beneficiary)

Same as in EF!

Location: MS or AC

Sector: Academic or Non-academic

- Can be International European Interest Organisation (IEIO)
- > Can be International Organisation(exceptional cases)
- Appoints the Supervisor
- Recruits the experienced researcher (contract of employment)

DOES NOT sign the Grant Agreement

DOES NOT recruit the researcher

DOES NOT claim costs directly from the action

Partner Organisation

Location: Third Country (not MS or AC)

Sector: Academic or Non-academic

- Can be International Organisation
- Nominates a Supervisor for the researcher
- Provides a signed Letter of Commitment (in the proposal)





RESEARCHER (future Fellow)

Mobility: from ANY country to the partner organisation in the

Third Country

Mobility rule: not more than 36 months years in the last 5 years in

the Third Country of the partner organisation

Nationality: national of MS/AC or long-term resident of a MS/AC

COFUND: KEY FEATURES European Commission

- ✓ EURAXESS portal for vacancies
- ✓ Budget: € 80 Million in 2017 (Doctoral Programmes: 30 Mio)
- ✓ Maximum € 10 Million per single applicant per call
- ✓ Duration of projects: min. 3 years, max. 5 years
- ✓ Fellowships: minimum 3 months

- ✓ Mono-beneficiary
- ✓ Legal entities (public and private) established in MS or AC and International European Interest Organisations (IEIO)

An overall threshold of 70% will be applied to the total weighted score.


Further Prioritization

- → if necessary, based on other appropriate characteristics
 - * decided by the panel
 - * related to the contribution of the proposal to the European Research Area and/or general objectives mentioned in the Work Programme
- → depends on available budget and call conditions



Overview of the evaluation process



Some tips


- Start early
